General Description

Teen Language Adventure (TLA) offers an effective small-group language course combined with an adventure in Canadian culture and lifestyle. In July and August, TLA welcomes teenagers from ages 13 to 17 from diverse areas of the globe to the world's largest bilingual, bicultural city: Montreal.

Classes are offered in English or French in small groups in the morning.

In the afternoon, TLA activities are chosen to ensure that students are offered a balance of sports with a variety of interesting cultural outings. TLA Monitors ensure that our young clients are well-supervised during activities.

TLA students stay in Homestay in a single room or residence. Special care is taken in selecting homestay hosts who have an active interest in younger students and who create a welcoming home for our TLA participants. Residence provides 24 hour supervision.

Campus

The TLA programme is held on a summer campus. It is an ideal facility and location for young students. The TLA campus is downtown at de Maissonneuve & Atwater and is a 12-minute walk from the LSC Montréal main school (or one metro stop).

Classes are held in spacious, air-conditioned classrooms. The campus grounds are beautiful and provide a lovely lunch location and sports playing grounds for our students. TLA students have classes and lunch on site.

The TLA Coordinator is available during class time to provide close liaison between the TLA campus and LSC Montréal.

LSC Monitors accompany students on all afternoon activities. After all afternoon activities, TLA Monitors return the students to LSC. The Coordinator is at LSC in the afternoon to greet the students as they return from activities. TLA students can use the internet and email in the LSC Student Resource Centre following afternoon activities.

At the end of the programme each day, TLA students have about 1-2 hours of free time. During this time they can use the internet or email at LSC or explore the city with their friends.

Instruction

Students have 3 lessons of class each morning. Students choose between English or French instruction. The programme provides language learning in an entertaining and meaningful context. Speaking and listening take priority.

First Day at School

On the First Day, TLA students go to LSC Montréal at 8:30 a.m. for testing and first day information session. After evaluation, registration and orientation, students will be taken on a tour of the TLA campus. The next day, students go directly to the TLA campus.

Included Activities

Designed for teenagers, TLA offers a balanced blend of activities which introduce TLA students to the city and its culture as well as provide them with many opportunities to participate in sports. Montreal is host to several festivals, artistic and cultural events. The planned afternoon schedule takes advantage of Montreal's many attractions so that students can enjoy the best summer has to offer.

LSC Monitors supervise our young students during the afternoon programme. They also act as guides on afternoon outings and as team leaders for sports. The Monitors are chosen for their experience working with or leading young people in group settings. All transportation and entrance fees are handled by the school.

Homestay or Residence

Which is best? Both homestay and residence offer advantages. LSC staff pay close attention to all types of accommodation to ensure that it is suitable for the student.

Homestay

TLA students can choose to stay in a Canadian home in a single room. Three meals are provided daily (students take a packed lunch to school).

Homestay provides students with the opportunity to use their language in real-life situations. They get a first-hand look at the way Canadians live.

In Canada, it is usual that both the homestay hostess and host work outside of the home during the day. TLA students are responsible for going to school and returning to homestay after activities by themselves.

Minimum age for homestay: 13.

Residence Accommodation

TLA students can choose to stay in residence. Three meals are provided daily (students take a packed lunch to school). Free internet is provided in the residence

























Residence provides 24/7 supervision. An LSC Monitor lives in residence with the students and accompanies them to and from school.





















Limited free time can be taken after school with written permission from the parents and all students must go out in groups of 2 or more.

Minimum age for residence: 13.
